Conn. Gov. Ned Lamont Under Fire from U.S. Tech Workers for Multi-Million Giveaway to India's Infosys

Who [U.S. Tech Workers](#) is fostering a movement to unite American tech workers and to advocate for H-1B work visa program reform and the prioritization of hiring U.S. tech workers.

What They will join the [Connecticut Tech Workers Coalition](#) and [Protect U.S. Workers](#) in a **protest rally** opposed to the \$14 million taxpayer-funded giveaway by Governor Ned Lamont to Infosys, an Indian multinational corporation specializing in outsourcing IT jobs.

Why For years, U.S. tech workers have been laid off from good jobs and forced to train their lower-cost foreign replacements, or risk losing severance pay. As well, tech workers are eliminated from the hiring process in favor of imported cheap labor. Numerous examples have been reported through the years, including here in Connecticut at Northeast Utilities (now Eversource).

And now, Connecticut Governor Ned Lamont is giving an Indian outsourcer \$14 million, reportedly to create 1,000 jobs in the state, but there's no real evidence jobs won't go to foreign workers.

Enough is enough! U.S. tech workers are fighting back!
